Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc.

Rules for Show Societies, Stewards, Judges, Exhibitors and Competitors at Agricultural Shows

- 1. This Show is conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc, the constitution and rules of this Society and any other regulation, which appears within the Schedule for individual sections of this Show. Should there be any conflict between the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc, the constitution and rules of this Society and the regulations appearing in any schedule, the constitution, rules and regulations appearing in the sched-ule of this Society shall prevail.
- 2. The President, Steward and/or the Committee person in charge of any section of this Show shall have the right to refuse any entry by an Exhibitor without expressing reason at any time up to the commencement of judging of the section to which that entry applies.
- 3. The Society reserves the right to refuse entry to any stall holder if the Society reasonably believes that it is necessary to do so in order to ensure that the standard, quality and safety of the Show is maintained.
- The President, Committee person in charge or Steward of any Section shall have the right to alter or amend the program or the time of any event.
- 5. This Society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident, loss, damage or non delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's Show, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising through any accident, loss, non delivery or damage whatsoever.
- 6. Exhibitors must obey all lawful orders of the President, Secretary, the Committee person in charge or the Steward of the Section in which the Exhibitor is entered. Failure to abide by any such order may incur a fine of an amount to be determined by the President of this Society or on the order of the President, the Exhibitor may be removed from the grounds together with the exhibit.
- 7. Stewards shall have the power to remove exhibitors or other persons from the vicinity of the Judge while judging.
- 8. The Judge's decision in any section shall be final.
- 9. Any protest by an Exhibitor must be lodged in writing with the Committee person or Steward in charge of any section within 30 minutes of the completion of the event together with a fee of \$50. The fee will be forfeited if the protest is considered to be frivolous or vexatious. The protest shall be heard according to the rules of the natural justice by a Dispute Committee of three appointed by the President of this show and the decision of the Disputes Committee shall be final.
- 10. Ribbons will be awarded at the Judge's discretion notwithstanding that there may be provision in the schedule for the awarding of ribbons.
- 11. Exhibitors shall ensure that they and all animals are entered and shown in the correct class.
- 12. All exhibitors must attend for judging at the appointed time and place. Judging shall not be delayed for an Exhibitor who is not ready and the Committee person in charge or Steward of a section shall have the right to exclude and disqualify the exhibitor competing in that section who does not present on time.
- 13. If, in the opinion of the Committee person in charge or Steward of a Section, any animal or exhibit is entered in the wrong class, the Committee person in charge or Steward of the Section shall have the power to enter the animal or exhibit in its correct class prior to the commencement of judging of that class.
- 14. Where there is an age limit on an Exhibitor, any of the following shall be accepted as proof of age:-
 - (a) A Birth Certificate
 - (b) A Drivers Licence
 - (c) Current Passport
- 15. Exhibitors shall at all times, behave in a proper and courteous manner to Judges, Show Officials and other Exhibitors. Should an Exhibitor behave in an offensive or improper manner, the Committee person in charge or Steward in the section shall have a right to exclude and disqualify that Exhibitor from competing in the Section.
- 16. All Exhibitors and/or grooms entering the show grounds shall obey the lawful directions of the President, Committee, Stewards or employees of the Show Society and failure or refusal to do so, shall entitle the President of this Society to disqualify the Exhibitor and/or his/her exhibit from competing at the Show and may order the removal of the Exhibitor and/or his/her exhibit from the grounds.
- 17. A Judge shall not adjudicate at more than one show, within the Banana Shire where practical, within 60 days unless judging different sections where it can be reasonably anticipated a number of the same exhibits are to be judged.
- 18. Judging cards and performance records shall be completed by the Committee person in charge, Steward and/or the Judge of a Section (if required) during or immediately after the judging of the Section or at the Judge's convenience.
- 19. Judges must be suitably attired when judging.
- 20. Competitors must be suitably attired when exhibiting.
- 21. If a Judge is unable to fulfill a judging commitment, the Judge shall notify the Show Society as soon as possible so a replacement can be arranged.
- 22. A Judge shall not send a substitute Judge. All invitations to judge shall be sent by this Society.
- 23. A Society shall report to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc any Judge who fails to attend a Show to which he or she has accepted an invitation to judge or, who has failed to judge at the time advertised for the commencement of the class provided that the failure to attend or appear is without reasonable cause.

- 24. A Judge may not officiate in one Section of a Show and compete or exhibit in another Section at the same show unless exceptional circumstances exist such as sickness or unavailability of the appointed Judge.
- 25. An Exhibitor shall not compete in a Section if the Exhibitor is a member of the Judge's immediate family.
- 26. An Exhibitor shall not compete nor show any animal in a section if the animal has been owned or leased by the Judge or a member of the Judge's immediate family or if the Judge is the Exhibitor's employer or business partner.
- 27. An Exhibitor shall not compete if the Exhibitor or any member of the Exhibitor's immediate family has provided accommodation for the Judge within three months prior to or during the holding of the Show.
- 28. An Exhibitor shall not compete if the Exhibitor or any animal being shown by the Exhibitor has been given tuition by the Judge or the Judge's business partner within three months prior to or during the show.
- 29. An exhibitor is ineligible to compete if the Exhibitor has employed or has been employed by or has been a business partner of the Judge of the Section within three months prior to or during the holding of the Show.
- 30. An Exhibitor shall not compete if the Exhibitor has given tuition to the Judge or has fed or trained an animal owned or leased by the Judge within three months prior to or during the Show.
- 31. A Judge shall not visit the livestock-housing complex of the Show Society, nor the owners, nor inspect or discuss any animal entered in the Show prior to or during the judging of the relevant section.
- 32. No Exhibitors shall deface or alter registration papers or performance cards for any exhibit.
- 33. A Judge or Steward must not knowingly permit an ineligible Exhibit or Exhibitor to compete.
- 34. No Exhibitor nor a member of the Exhibitor's immediate family or anybody employed by the Exhibitor shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision made by the Judge unless they first obtain permission from the Committee person in charge or Steward of the Section.
- 35. In Breed Classes, all animals must have Current Registration & Ownership Certificate with the Breed Society.
- 36. In Breed Classes, registration papers (where applicable) must be available at the Show as proof of registration.
- 37. An Exhibitor required by the Show Section Schedule or rules of this Society to parade an exhibit in the grand parade and who fails to do so, shall not be entitled to and shall forfeit any prize money or trophy to that Exhibitor and/or for that Exhibit.
- 38. The Exhibitor shall ensure that they and their exhibit comply at all times with all statutes, regulations and by-laws applying to the showground at the time of the show including but not limited to all animal health requirements.
- 39. Exhibitors and Space Holders who bring electrical equipment into the show grounds must comply with current legislation.
- 40. Where animals are being led, worked and displayed, it is the responsibility of the owner/handler at the time to ensure the animal does not become a public safety liability.
- 41. Dogs, other than those owned by members of the Canine Control Council, must be kept in a closed float, a vehicle or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it being able to injure or bite any person or other animal.
- 42. Any competitor who receives any physical or electronic communication aid during the judging of an event will have all nominations cancelled. The persons concerned may be asked to leave the Showground.
- 43. Energised electric fences are prohibited on the Showground at any time unless in a specified area and suitably signed.
- 44. Rules for individual Sections shall be as per the attached Schedule(s) and they shall be read in conjunction with the rules.
- 45. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of Queensland Ag Shows and the society relevant to this schedule, in addition to any special regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained from the Queensland Ag Shows website www.qldagshows.com.au/competitions/young-judges-paraders/ or the show society relevant to this schedule.

ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE POLICY

- The Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. considers that any Judge, Steward or Person who is affected by alcohol or drugs while performing a duty at an Agricultural Show or Show Committee organised Function, is considered an unacceptable form of behaviour which will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- The Chamber considers that all persons assisting at a Show or function should be free of any intimidation or embarrassment caused by any person who is affected by alcohol or drugs.
- 3. The Executive or the Show Society or person in charge of the Event must ensure that any Judge, Steward or Person is not subject to any behaviour which is a personal embarrassment to the Members of the Show Society

- or renders the Show Society in disrepute.
- Any reports of alcohol or drug abuse will be treated seriously and action will be taken immediately to remedy the problem.
- 5. Disciplinary action may be taken against any person who is in breach of these protocols.
- Any Judge, Steward or Person affected by alcohol or drugs by their actions may be liable under the Workplace, Health and Safety Act.
- Disciplinary action arising from any incident involving alcohol or drug abuse may involve a warning, dismissal or referral to authorities.

ANIMAL WELFARE STATEMENT

Callide Valley Agricultural & Pastoral Society Incorporated (CVAPS) has a proud history of educating people about agriculture. Animals play an integral role in achieving this aim and as such, CVAPS holds a duty of care to support the welfare of all animals whilst on CVAPS property.

Callide Valley Agricultural & Pastoral Society Incorporated takes seriously its responsibility to provide people and facilities which promote good animal welfare.

Accordingly, all animals are:

- Provided with fresh water and adequate nutrition;
- Housed in comfortable surrounds with adequate space;
- Monitored for pain, injury and disease, and treated or relieved of suffering where necessary;
- Managed in such a way as to minimize stress and exhaustion; and
- Free from any drugs which modify their behaviour or mask harmful health conditions.

Care of animals on CVAPS property is underpinned by relevant State animal welfare legislation and codes of practice/standards and guidelines specifying requirements of their transportation, exhibition and management.

Recognising the critical role people play in ensuring animal welfare, CVAPS ensures that its officials and volunteers are suitably trained and experienced in providing for the welfare of animals, and are supported in their roles to identify and address concerns.

All owners and/or appointed guardians of animals on CVAPS property are reminded of their duty of care to take all reasonable measures to ensure the welfare of their animals.

Whilst observing community values and expectations pertaining to animal welfare, CVAPS strives to safeguard the rights of animal owners, exhibitors, competitors and CVAPS officials and volunteers.

CVAPS will promptly and actively respond to animal welfare incidents should they arise and engages with relevant stakeholders from time to time to ensure standards and practices are subject to continuous improvement.

CVAPS's underlying principle in relation to animal welfare is to promote education and exhibition through animal-human interaction, without compromising the welfare of animals or their patrons' enjoyment and learning experience.

Special Show Regulations & By-Laws

Opening

The show will be open to the public on Friday, 17th May, 8.00 am to 10.00 pm and Saturday 18th May, 8.00 am to 10.30 pm. The Opening Ceremony will take place at 1.00 pm on Friday 17th May 2024.

Admission

Family Pass \$55(admits 2 adults and children under 13 years and their high school children with I.D. 2 day pass). Single Pass \$35 (admits a single adult 2 day pass). Pensioners \$12. Members, on presentation of their membership tickets, will be admitted to the grounds. Non-members will be charged an admission of \$25, school children under 13 years \$5, high school children with I.D. Badges \$10. Ringside car reserve \$20 a day (conditions apply). Other parking in designated areas on grounds is free of charge.

General Regulations pertaining to the Annual Show

- 1. The prizes will be awarded subject to appended General Regulations and Conditions, and notes as set forth in the Prize Schedules, and these are to be the conditions of competition.
- 2. The exhibition shall take place on the Society's Ground or where the committee may appoint. The Committee reserve the right at any time to postpone the Exhibition, or any event thereof in consequence of the inclemency of the weather or from any other sufficient cause, to a date or dates deemed suitable by the Committee, and no entrance fee shall be returned in the event of such postponement. The reasonableness of the cause or causes for postponement shall be decided by the Committee and their judgment shall be conclusive, and not be open to question by any exhibitor or other person affected by such postponement.
- 3. The Committee may abandon the Exhibition or any event thereof through wet weather, or for any other reason which may make such a course ad-visable in their opinion. Should the exhibition or any event be abandoned or cancelled, exhibitors shall be entitled to a return of the entry fee paid in such event or events as may be cancelled, but no cause or action, liability or obligation shall be maintainable, or be incurred by the Committee, or by the Society by reason of such abandonment or cancellation.
- 4. All entries must be made on printed forms to be obtained from the Secretary on application as it is from these documents the catalogue and Steward's books will be compiled. It is necessary that the whole of the questions contained in them shall be answered as far as possible, and no entry forms will be valid unless signed by the exhibitor or his agent. These forms shall be forwarded to the Secretary by post or otherwise so as to reach the office of the Society on or before the date when entries close. Entry fees must in all cases be remitted with the entry forms. Entry fee will be acknowledged on official receipt form but not returned by post unless entry is accompanied by stamped self-addressed envelope.
- 5. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the Exhibitor may be transferred to the proper class by the Stewards
- 6. Exhibitors of stud cattle, horses and goats for competition, must at the time of entry, state age, breed and breeder (if possible) together with Herd Book or registered number.
- 7. An Exhibitor or his agent, who shall make a false report or give misleading information respecting any exhibit, shall be held to have forfeited any prize gained by these means. The exhibit and exhibitor, together with the agent (if any) may be disqualified and the matter reported to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.
- 8. The grounds will be open for admission of exhibits at the times shown at the head of each Section in the Schedule. Horses may be removed at 5 pm each day, but must be returned to their respective positions by 7.30 am on the following days of the Show, failing which, all prizes awarded to them will be forfeited. Any exhibitors failing to comply with this Regulation may be debarred from entering in the following year.
- The Society will not be responsible for any accident caused through or by any exhibit and will not under any
 circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or miss delivery of Livestock, or other Exhibits of any kind, or for any
 damage done thereto.
- 10. All exhibits must be delivered to and removed from the grounds at the cost and risk of the exhibitor.
- 11. All persons exhibiting must accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Committee, and on all protests the decision of the Committee shall be final, and without appeal. Provided that any Exhibitor shall have the right of appealing against disqualification imposed, as provided for in the Constitution of the *Chamber of Agricultural Societies*. Any person or persons interfering with a Judge, or who shall be guilty of unseemly conduct to Judge or Stewards or Officials, of the Society, or any exhibitor refusing in any way to carry out the instructions of a Steward, shall be liable at the discretion of the Committee, to a penalty not exceeding \$20 or, together with his or their exhibits, or otherwise may be expelled from the Ground.
- 12. All exhibits to be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor. Nothing to indicate ownership of any exhibit will be permitted (the usual brand on livestock excepted). Any person objecting to any award, or to an exhibit, must enter a protest in writing fully setting out the grounds of such objection, and lodge it with the Secretary, up to noon on the day following the award, and no protest shall be subsequently received unless the Committee be satisfied with the reason assigned for the delay. Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if the Committee finds the protest frivolous. Protests will be considered by the committee within 24 hours of the lodgment. Entries are received for prizes offered by the Society on the express condition that the decision of the Committee on all objection disputes, and protests shall be accepted as final, and that the Exhibitor agrees to observe and be bound by the Rules and Regulations of the Society.
- 13. Should any exhibit, having obtained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the prize. The Committee, with or without the advice of the judge, shall decide the question.
- 14. All prizes awarded at the Show shall be payable within fourteen (14) days after the Show, except in cases where protests are entered. All prizes not applied for within three months after the Show will be forfeited to the Society.
- 15. The judges will not award prizes in classes in which the exhibits are not considered to possess sufficient merit.
- 16. No decorations or award cards, except such as are provided by the Committee, shall be placed on any exhibit, or affixed thereto at the Exhibition then being held.

- 17. The Prize Awards affixed to all exhibits shall be clearly defined and a different colour for each. Ribbons will only be issued to Livestock Exhibits, and no duplicate ribbons will be issued.
- 18. All special prizes presented to the Society must be for open competition i.e. they must not be given for the progeny of any particular animal etc., and shall be governed by the Rules of the Society.
- 19. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Committee reserve the right of refusing admittance to, or removing same from the Grounds at the expense of the Exhibitor.
- 20. The Committee may refuse or cancel any entry without giving reason for doing so.
- 21. One of the main objects of these exhibitions is to afford an opportunity to the public to improve their collections at a time when they are best enabled to form a correct opinion on the merit of the several varieties. Exhibitors are requested to attach the price on each exhibit for sale (The Secretary must be notified of any exhibit that is for sale and all enquiries regarding sales must be made through the Secretary or Stewards, other than livestock auctioned).
- 22. Vehicles containing supplies will be admitted on the Ground up to 8 am free each day of the Show, but must leave the ground as soon as unloaded, or requested to do so by any of the Stewards or Officials. No horse shall be ridden or vehicle driven (except in the vehicle reserve) unless competing in the show. All decisions to be subject to the discretion of the Committee.
- 23. No person except those actually in charge of stock (who shall wear a badge supplied by the Secretary), will be permitted to remain in the Judging ring during the adjudication, under any pretext whatever, and they must on no account leave their respective lots, unless authorised by the Stewards.
- 24. The attention of the exhibitor is especially drawn to the foregoing regulations. Any disregard of same will render the exhibitor liable for disqualification.
- 25. A Grand Horse Parade shall be held on Friday approximately 2:30pm in which all horse exhibitors at the show are encouraged to take part. All prize winners to exhibit in the parade and eligible entrants will receive \$10 for parading with their ribbons on horseback or leading. The stewards may at their discretion cancel the parade. In the event the parade is cancelled the prize money will be distributed at the stewards discretion. A Grand Parade is anticipated for Saturday approximately 2pm.
- 26. The Committee shall have the power to retain any exhibit until all fines are paid.
- 27. No exhibitor of livestock shall be permitted to use any part of stall other than those allotted to them by the Stewards.
- 28. Necessary attendants upon stock will be furnished with special passes upon applying at the Secretary's office. Not more than one attendant's pass will be issued to any exhibitor except where it is shown that extra attendants are required.
- 29. Passes are positively not transferable under any circumstances. Exhibitors who may desire to change their attendants must have their passes exchanged at the Secretary's office. The names of all attendants must be written on all passes, and no pass will be accepted at the gate until the name of such attendant has been written thereon in ink.
- 30. No side show of any description shall be permitted on the Show grounds during the exhibition without having first paid the necessary rental and obtained a permit from the Secretary.
- 31. No person shall be entitled to a refund for any entry fees paid, unless a claim is lodged with the Secretary before the time on which the event is to take place or the Class is judged. However, such refund may be paid if a special recommendation is received from the steward in charge of the particular event or class, that the withdrawal of the entry was done on the advice of the Steward or Judge.
- 32. Space Hirers are to ensure that ALL power leads and electrical appliances display a current tag indicating that each approved by an authorised person in accordance with the requirements of the Workplace, Health and Safety Act i.e.has been tested after the 1 January 2024.

Duties of Exhibitors, Stewards and Judges Exhibitors:

1. Exhibitors, when entering exhibits, must furnish the Secretary with a description of the exhibit and the number of the class they which to compete in. Entries must be made on printed forms where possible and entry fee must accompany entries.

- 2. Exhibitors must obtain Section cards from the Secretary, affix to exhibits and deliver to the Stewards of the Section, at or before the hours advertised for the judging.
- 3. Exhibits must not be removed without the permission of the Stewards.
- 4. Exhibits of stock must have an attendant to parade same at hours notified.

Stewards:

- 1. Stewards names shall appear in the Prize Schedule above their section.
- 2. Stewards must be in attendance at the Showground at the hour appointed to receive exhibits.
- 3. Stewards are responsible for the proper classification of exhibits, and all exhibits must be ready for judging.
- 4. Any exhibit suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be reported immediately to the Secretary, who will order its removal.
- 5. Stewards will obtain the Award Books from the Secretary, and direct the judges to exhibits they are appointed to judge.
- Stewards shall attend on the judges to afford any information required but will not do or say anything to influence their decision.
- 7. Stewards shall remove exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the judges while judging.
- 8. Stewards will obtain their prize cards from the Secretary and affix same to exhibit, after filling in names of successful exhibitors and other particulars.
- 9. Stewards will obtain the Award Books from the Judges when filled up and signed and deliver same to Secretary.
- 10. A judge shall not be an exhibitor in the Section in which they are judging.

Judges:

- 1. Judges are requested to attend at the Secretary's office on the Showground before the appointed judging time, introduce themselves to the Secretary and to the Stewards of the Section.
- 2. Judges will receive Award Books from the lead has been tested and Stewards of the Section
- 3. Judges, as they arrive at their decision, will write their award, with any remark they may desire, in the Award Books.
- 4. Judges shall disqualify any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations, and shall enter their reason in their books.
- Judges may recommend for certificates or commend as they think fit, any exhibits of special merit not included in the Schedule of prizes, and will not award prizes in any class in which the exhibits are not considered in their opinion, to possess sufficient merit.
- 6.. Judges will sign the Award Books and deliver them to the Stewards of the section.
- 7. Judges to claim fee, traveling expenses etc, if required before leaving grounds.



- 1. The show society kindly requests that all prize winners exhibit in the Grand Horse Parade on Friday, ~2:30pm
- 2. BIO SECURITY It is compulsory to complete a Horse Health Declaration for ALL Horses entering an affiliated Agricultural Society Showgrounds.
- 3. All campers and camping competitors are required to pay the camping fee of \$25 per vehicle and produce receipt when required for the duration of the show, even if no horse stalls are required. Vehicle registrations will be checked and entry to events will be refused if camping fee has not been paid. Duration of Show is Friday and Saturday night of the Show (2 Nights) Extra nights will incur a fee of \$12.50 Per Night
- 4. All Competitors / horse handlers and / or their guardians must sign a waiver form and Infectious disease and Horse Booking form prior to competing.
- 5. Entry to ring events is by ticket system to be purchased on Thursday afternoon between 4 & 5pm or on day of competition. The exception is the Cutting events, Please refer to specific sections as nomination is required before the show. All competitors must wear a Gate Entry Wrist Band to compete.
- 6. Tickets must be completed in full & CAPITAL LETTERS Stewards will not complete entry forms. Tickets must be handed to the Steward before the commencement of the event. There will be no refund on entry tickets.
- 7. STRICTLY COMPETITORS ONLY ALLOWED IN THE RING. NO SPECTACTORS ALLOWED (by direction of the ty Officer). No Prams/strollers & young non-competitors allowed in the ring.
- 8. Ponies may be ridden by riders of any age, however, common sense must prevail to ensure Ponies are not Overmounted / Over-weighted and Rider safety is maintained.
- Judges and Stewards are to dismiss any entry from the ring where there are any perceived Animal Welfare issue, or Safety concerns involving any Rider, Horse or its Gear.
- 10. Abuse of stewards or judges will not be tolerated.
- 11. All particpants receive \$10 cash for parading with ribbons on horseback or leading in the Grand Horse Parade.
- 12. Competitors who place 2nd in any event that has a champion must be ready to come into the ring for Reserve Champion Judging when the event is being judged.
- 13. Competitors to have the course walked from 7:30am—8:00am ready for an 8:00am start.
- 14. It is the responsibility of competitors to not bring sick animals (eg. diahorrea, cold/flu, infectious skin condition) onto the show grounds.
- 15. The Show Society may carry out random tests for drugs in horses.
- 16. According to Equestrian Australia regulations helmets must be worn and must have proof of meeting the required Standards (yellow sticker).
- 17. No stallion will be allowed to compete in hack classes.
- 18. Stallions to enter Rings 1 and 2 via Camp draft Cutout Yard- other horses to keep clear of this "stallion alley".
- 19. For all classes in which the age of the horse is a condition of the competition, the age which will be attained on August 1st next ensuing will be used and the exhibit will be entered accordingly.
- 20. Where the height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured in the presence of the Ring Steward if required and at the Judge's discretion. It will be optional with the Stewards to accept a Certificate of Measurement issued by a recognized official measurer or by the Royal Society of New South Wales, Victoria and that National A. and I.A. of Queensland provided the animals were five years old at the date of issue of the certificate. Measuring Certificates will be supplied by the Society.
- 21. Competitors will be asked by the Stewards to produce evidence of horse registration.
- 22. All Class winners are eligible to compete for championships without special entry.
- 23. No horse or pony will be allowed to come into the ring with ribbons except on parade.
- 24. Dogs, other than those owned by members of the Canine Control Council, must be kept in a closed float, a vehicle or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it being able to injure or bite any person or other animal. Under No circumstances will a dog be allowed in center ring.
- 25. Novelty events will be run as stewards may direct.
- 26. In the event of two events clashing the competitor or competitors must decide in which event to compete in as no event will be delayed (at the discretion of the stewards and judges)
- 27. In each class where one entry is received, a ribbon will be awarded and prize money paid provided the entry is of sufficient merit in the opinion of the judge
- 28. If there are 3 or less competitors only 1st place prizemoney will be awarded at the Judge's discretion.
- 29. All Prize money & Championship prizes will be paid from the Ring.
- 30. Definitions -
 - **Maiden** Horses must be maidens at the time of competing. "Maiden" shall be deemed to mean any horse that has not won a first prize at any affiliated Society Show.
 - **Novice** Horses must be "novices" at the time of competition. Novice shall be deemed to mean any horse that has not won a championship prize at any affiliated Society Show or an Open Challenge

Pony - must not exceed 14 hands

Galloway - must be over 14 hands and not exceed 15 hands



Inanimate Objects - Inanimate objects are things that aren't 'living', anything that cannot grow, reproduce or die. Living objects/people may appear in the image but should not be the focus of the photographer

General Photography Hints:

A photo should be about something. Decide what is the main point of your image and then compose your image accordingly. Do not include items that do not support the subject of your image. If the colourful sky is the highlight of your shot do not fill the bottom half of the image with the boring land. Place the horizon at the bottom third of the image so that two thirds of the shot is the stunning sky. If you divide your shot up with horizontal and vertical lines at 1/3 spacings to form a naughts and crosses grid (#) your final image will look better if the points of interest are placed along these lines or even better at one of the intersections. Consider making the scene more interesting by taking it from a viewpoint not always observed by the viewer. Get up higher and look down or get down lower and look up, get really close. For people shots (and animals as well), the eyes are very important. You should focus on the eye so that in the final image it is sharp. To achieve highlights in the eyes have the subject look towards the light or use a flash. To avoid red-eye don't have the subject look directly at the camera or use an off camera flash. Don't always use your camera in the horizontal, flip it 90 degrees and use it in the vertical mode. Photos of people often work better in the vertical or portrait mode. Photos of the countryside are often suited to the horizontal or landscape mode.

A good photographer also develops a good sense of light. They know how to see the light in a scene and are able to place the subject in the light and then use the shadows to add drama and mood to the image.

Above all remember there are no hard and fast rules. Keep using your camera, it will be the most important thing you do when becoming a photographer

Remember.. appreciation of a good photo is highly subjective - you will not always agree with a Judge's opinion and that doesn't matter.


